Increasing availability and access to nourishing food

Second Chance Foods elevates the health of people and the planet by recovering nutrient dense food from local sources, and providing it to organizations that address hunger, in order to break the cycle of wasted food and food insecurity. In 2024, we have cooked over 71,700 meals and delivered 219,340 pounds of fresh groceries to our community partners (through August). In April, we moved into a new facility, which is larger, allows for concurrent programming, has a central community location, and provides growth throughout our organization. As a result, we expect to increase services by 15-20% this year alone, with continued growth after that. Over 80% of our groceries and meals serve Putnam and Dutchess County recipients.
